ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Kennewick School District No. 17 from September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the District. We also determined whether the District complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Bond compliance
- Enrollment
- Staff mix
- Financial condition
- General disbursements
- Small and attractive assets
- Transportation

RESULTS

In the areas we examined, the District's internal controls were adequate to safeguard public assets. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Kennewick School District No. 17, located in Benton County, provides educational services to approximately 16,000 students in prekindergarten through 12th grade. The District encompasses 292 square miles including the city of Kennewick and the unincorporated community of Plymouth. The District operates three high schools, an alternative high school, one project based high school, a skill center, four middle schools, 13 elementary schools, a parent partnership, and one preschool. In addition, the District also holds classes at the Juvenile Justice Center.

An elected, five-member Board of Directors governs the District. The Board appoints management to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its approximately 1,600 employees. For fiscal year 2013 the District operated on a \$152 million annual budget.
