Emergency Removal

The methods employed in enforcing the rules of the school involve professional judgment. Established procedures must be followed in correcting misbehavior. Appeal procedures have been established in order to provide for an opportunity for every corrective action or punishment to be reviewed by someone in authority and to instill confidence among students and parents as to the essential fairness of school district personnel.

In order to develop an environment conducive to learning; the principal shall confer with certificated staff members at least once per year to develop and/or review rules of conduct to be employed in the event of rule infractions.

Limitations on Classroom Exclusion:

- a. Duration of classroom exclusion. A classroom exclusion may be administered for all or any portion of the balance of the school day in which the student was excluded from the student's classroom or instructional or activity area. When a student is excluded from the student's classroom or instructional or activity area for longer than the balance of the school day, the school must provide notice and due process for a suspension, expulsion, or emergency expulsion.
- b. Removal from school. A student may not be removed from school during a classroom exclusion unless the school provides notice and due process for a suspension, expulsion, or emergency expulsion.
- c. Assignments and tests. The school must provide the student an opportunity to make up any assignments and tests missed during the classroom exclusion.
