OIL PAINTING FOR BEGINNERS - 306S20

The list of supplies below will be discussed at the first class. It is recommended that you bring a canvas, pencil and idea to paint to the first class. The remaining items can be purchased after the first class, if you prefer.

- Canvas - any size
- Ideas for painting (example: animals, flowers, landscape, etc.) Bring a picture or a drawing of what you would like to paint.
- Oil paints (Grumbacher is best): White, Titanium (large tube), Cadmium Red medium, Cadmium Yellow medium, Cadmium Green, Ultramarine or Cobalt blue, Yellow Ochre, Burnt Sienna, Burnt Umber, Payne's Gray
- Variety of brushes (round, flat, slanted - choose quality)
- Paper palette
- Quick drying medium – Liquin (excellent)
- Container for medium
- Odorless thinner for cleaning brushes & container (jar)
- Easel
- Pencil

WATERCOLOR PAINTING - 307S20

- Rag or paper towels
- Pencil, any number or weight
- #4 and #8 watercolor brushes
- 3 or more sheets of watercolor paper and/or watercolor pad
- Panel to adhere watercolor paper
- One tube or pan of red, yellow and blue watercolor paint (bring additional colors if you want)
- Palette or suitable object to act as a palette (ex. dinner plate)

PASTELS AND CHALK - 302S20

- Set of pastels or chalk containing red, yellow and blue
- White or colored paper
- Eraser set



ACRYLIC PAINTING - 308S20

- 8" X 10" or 12" X 16" painting panel
- One tube each white, red, yellow, orange, green & blue paint, either acrylic or oils. (These must be basic colors, meaning real red, real blue, real yellow, etc...)
- Brushes, #4 #8 #12 either flats or rounds.
- Odorless turpentine or paint thinner if you are using oils
- Container to hold water or turpentine
- Rags or paper towels

WATERCOLOR BRUSH LETTERING - 313S20

- Watercolor paint (an inexpensive brand is fine)
- Water brush (small/fine or medium tip) (recommended: Brea Reese Waterbrush or Pentel Arts Aquash Water Brush (fine tip))
- Pad of watercolor paper
- Pencil (not mechanical)
- Cup for water
- Paper towels

KNITTING BASICS - 312S20

- Sharp scissors
- Pen or pencil with eraser
- Yarn – approx. 220 yds. light colored, worsted weight (wool or superwash wool preferred)
- Needles – US 6, US 7, or US 8 (1 circular 24" cord preferred)
